


Race and Animals: Colonization and the Discourse of Species, Fall 2018:

Literary Animals, Winter 2020:

"Professor Thiyagarajan provides such a pleasant learning environment for her students to discuss animals in literature, and has done an incredible job transitioning to online teaching this semester.
